He was a deeply curious and respectful interviewer, always genuinely interested in peoples' stories.

Chris adored his two sons - Joshua and Jacob, Jacob's fiancé Dori, his magical granddaughter Amya, and his partner Lizann. Chris loved his family, first and most. He was very grateful for the time he spent with his children, his sister Sarai and her family, and his parents.

Chris fought prostate cancer for four and a half long years. There were more good times than bad.
