We agree with the administration concerning the policy which states that political issues should not be pushed within the school. We call upon the administration to either follow its policy or change it.

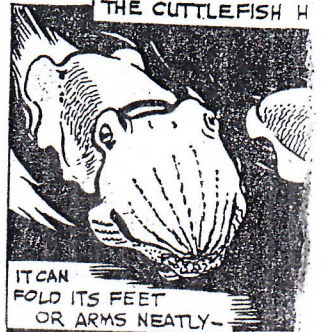

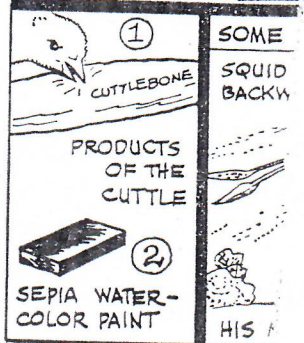

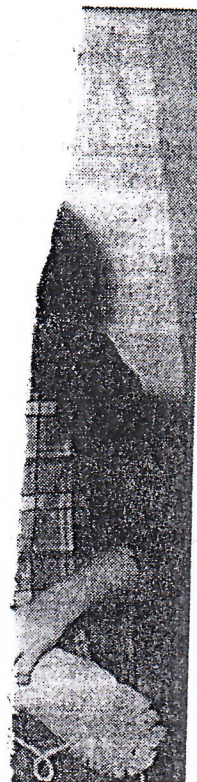


QUESTION: Where does tlebone come from?
